The word "Oklahoma", which translates to Red People, was suggested in 1866 by Choctaw Nation Chief Allen Wright during negotiations with the US government. It comes for the Choctaw words okla, meaning "people", and humma meaning "red". The name was official approved in 1890. As patriotic and proud Oklahomans, I hope you will join me in making this project a reality!
